Supporting and Empowering New Yorkers in Need

HeartShare and its Family of Services empower children, adults and families to attain greater independence.

HeartShare's Developmental Disabilities Services support and empower children and adults with intellectual and developmental disabilities, including autism, Down Syndrome and cerebral palsy.

Autism Services customize residential, day services and education programs specifically for children and adults with autism.

Residential Services include group homes and supportive apartments for individuals with disabilities that prioritize a family atmosphere and community inclusion.

Day Habilitation Services offer inclusive, customized life skills training, community volunteerism, as well as social and recreational activities to build greater independence.

Community Habilitation supports people with disabilities living at home to pursue their life goals and learn skills through a one-to-one relationship with a Direct Support Professional.

Pre-Vocational and Supported Employment Programs

prepare people with disabilities for competitive jobs with employment partners like Modell's Sporting Goods and Queens College, through work tryouts leading to permanent jobs.

Family Support Services offer diverse resources, including day and overnight respite opportunities, to families taking on the 24/7 responsibility of caring for a loved one with a disability.

Individual Support Services, which includes Medicaid Services Coordination and Self-Direction, collaborate with people with disabilities to create and implement personally meaningful goals and services.

Pre-School Education Services provide education and therapies for special needs students ages 3-5 along with Universal Pre-Kindergarten services for typically developing 4 year olds. Evaluations and referrals are available for children who may have a developmental delay.

Foster Care and Prevention Programs strengthen families in times of crisis. HSVS partners with parents to provide the tools and skills necessary to build loving, happy family environments for children and youth to thrive. HSVS finds stable loving homes for children, as well as offers family services to prevent the placement of children into foster care.

Integrated Health Services provides skills-based therapy and healthcare management to empower individuals to achieve wellness. HSVS guides clients as they work to strengthen their family and social relationships, achieve personal goals and contribute more meaningfully to their communities. HSVS has Outpatient Mental Health and Chemical Dependence Clinics.

Residential and Housing Programs provide safe homes to those most in need. By providing a safe, caring, and stable living situation, along with targeted support services, program participants are able to begin the work needed to overcome the challenges in their lives. HSVS supported apartments and group homes offer vulnerable children, youth and adults a safe place to reach their goals and transition to a more independent life.

Youth Development and Community Programs
